Mathematics

Cowplain students built links with higher education by working alongside students from the University of Portsmouth in a workshop dedicated to Problem Solving.

Students from Years 9 and 10 paired up to solve replicas of questions from the new GCSE Mathematics specification. The problems were aimed at all ages and abilities allowing all students to access the challenges.

Our students were very competitive, with some managing to answer questions that had previously appeared on AS Level Mathematics papers!



United Kingdom Mathematics Trust

In February, students from Years 9 and 10 took part in the UKMT Challenge, an international Mathematics challenge involving students across the United Kingdom and Europe.

The challenge involved answering 25 multiple choice questions in one hour and was sat in school under normal exam conditions.

The top 40% of students nationally received a Gold, Silver or Bronze certificate and each institution received a Best in School certificate.

For this year's challenge, Jackson Chandler (9AN) achieved the highest score in the school. He received a Gold certificate for his success and was entered into the next stage of the competition, the Kangaroo Challenge. **Well done Jackson!**


Example question and answer from UKMT Challenge:


The circle has radius 1 cm. Two vertices of the square lie on the circle. One edge of the square goes through the centre of the circle, as shown.


What is the area of the square?

A
$$\frac{4}{5}$$
 cm² B $\frac{\pi}{5}$ cm² C 1 cm² D $\frac{\pi}{4}$ cm² E $\frac{5}{4}$ cm²

Let the length of the side of the square be 2x cm. Then, using Pythagoras' Theorem in the triangle shown, $(2x)^2 + x^2 = 1^2$. So $4x^2 + x^2 = 1$. Therefore $x^2 = \frac{1}{5}$ and the area of the square is $4x^2$ cm² = $\frac{4}{5}$ cm².
