We are extremely ambitious for our 890 students and have a strong vision to ensure that the life-chances of every young person are enhanced by quality teaching, leading to excellent outcomes. Having secured a 'Good' OFSTED in July 2018 we are now looking for staff who can take us to 'Outstanding.'

At Cowplain we believe that all students can be highly successful mathematicians. We want students to see how Maths touches so many areas of everyday life, is a gateway for the study of other subjects and is the universal language of the world. We want students to enjoy the study of Maths for Maths sake, even when it appears abstract.

We believe that achieving success in studying complex and abstract ideas in our curriculum will in turn help our young people to develop skills such as resilience and self-belief and open up opportunities in the future even if they do not seem open at the time. Maths Department Details

Our lively and dedicated team currently consists of eight full-time and part-time maths teachers including the Head of Department and two Assistant Heads of Department. We also have support from other staff.

To create successful learners we work together and value the ideas and strengths of each team member. We each take responsibility for, and are supported in, developing and improving our own and the department's good practice.

Our teaching facilities and resources are very good. We have dedicated classrooms with digital projectors (all with interactive whiteboards), textbooks, Hegarty Maths licences and practical equipment for use in the classroom.

Key Stage 3 is completed by students in Year 7 and Year 8, working within our Mastery curriculum.

Students commence GCSE in Year 9 and study the linear Edexcel GCSE course.

Students are set by attainment in year group halves and each year group has 7 or 8 one hour lessons across the two-week timetable. All full-time teachers work across the full age and attainment range.

The aim of the mathematics department is to encourage **all** students to become successful and independent learners of mathematics. We also aim to equip all students with the skills that they will require for everyday life, so that they are capable, confident and competent when using mathematics wherever their future may take them. We believe effective understanding of mathematical concepts comes through positive and focussed student interaction and discussion, consolidated learning and problem-solving experience.

Our challenge is to build on our success and implement changes which enable us to meet these aims.

SECOND IN MATHS

The Second in Department is responsible to the Headteacher in all matters, and to the Head of Maths in respect of curriculum and timetable matters.

The Second in Department is expected to assist the Head of Department in all matters relating to the subject responsibilities in the job description, and to undertake the responsibilities outlined under additional specific responsibilities and general duties.

The Second in Department is expected to take specific responsibility for areas of the job description, as delegated by the Head of Department, in addition to the requirements/responsibilities of a Teacher as outlined in the STPCD.

SUBJECT RESPONSIBILITIES ARE LIKELY TO INCLUDE:

- a) Planning, implementing and reviewing the curriculum within the framework of the National Curriculum.
- b) Ensuring that all OFSTED inspection requirements are met, e.g. departmental policies and development plans.
- c) Ensuring that assessment is regular, thorough, and meets the school's assessment policy.
- d) Developing and training of staff in the department; participating in Performance Management; supervising newly qualified teachers as part of the process of induction.
- e) Holding regular departmental meetings with a learning focus within the directed time budget.
- f) Representing the department in all matters related to the curriculum.
- g) Liaising with other departments in the school.
- h) Ensuring departmental representation at all appropriate meetings
- i) Co-operating with the Assistant Headteacher in developing links with partner primary schools, colleges and local employers.
- j) Liaising with SLT in all matters concerned with the timetable and curriculum.
- k) Planning future subject developments within the department.
- I) Keeping the department within its budget.
- m) Ensuring that the stock and equipment are well cared for and economically used.
- n) Supervising the work of departmental support staff.
- o) Ensuring the safety of students and staff.
- p) Ensuring that the departmental rooms present a stimulating environment.
- q) Organising GCSE and other examination entries.
- r) Organising teaching group arrangements within the department.
- s) Implementing the school's policies, e.g. Behaviour, Home learning Rewards, etc.
- t) Undertake any professional duty reasonably assigned by the Headteacher
