Y6 Masterclasses

At The Cowplain School, we strongly believe in encouraging students to reach their full potential, even before they join us in Year 7. Therefore, we were excited to be able to offer Year 6 pupils the opportunity to join us during the Autumn Term for some educational and fun after-school clubs. We offered a range of free activities to give pupils the opportunity to see what learning is like at secondary school, meet some of their future teachers, and experience our facilities at The Cowplain School.





Tech:

Pupils explored the theme of Electricity in Technology by using new equipment and machinery.

In Week 1 pupils learnt how to use the sewing machine. They did this by learning about the parts of the machine, the difference between old and new, and took part in a sewing machine race. In Week 2 they learnt about the science behind bread, and how to use machinery in the food room in a safe way!

We were very impressed with how all pupils had a go with working with machinery which they may not have used before. Well Done!



We used pocket-sized computer to show how software and hardware work together. The pupils enjoyed using the pocket-sized computer to program it to display their names, make an electronic die and then move onto the creation of a Tamagotchi and then on to design, assembly and implementation of their very own smart-watches.

Pupils showed a lot of grit, one of our school values, to design and program their Tamagotchis.





Art:

We were delighted to welcome the Y6 students to the Art Department where they showed us their creativity. Pupils created oil pastel transfers using images of light bulbs, pylons, and lightning to inspire us. Pupils were inspired by Pop Art and created onomatopoeia works using words like 'fizz' 'pop' and 'frazzle'. Matilda and Olivia showed creativity in both sessions. Well done!

Science:

Y6 pupils worked on the theme of Electricity in their Wednesday Science sessions. The pupils had the exciting opportunity to construct their own circuits using Connection Electricity Kits, make LEDs light up using only graphite pencil lines to conduct electricity and power their own lights and clocks using the citric acid from lemons and lime fruit. Lauren and Daisy showed real curiosity, one of our school values, to find out how and why electricity makes things work. Well done!
