saved Sima from life in a ghetto.







The service was a stark reminder that every person involved in the Holocaust was 'ordinary': ordinary people were murdered, ordinary people were bystanders, and ordinary people committed the horrific acts that took place in the Genocide. The students were able to reflect about how we must be careful to ensure we do not become the next group of 'Ordinary People' to experience such a terrible event.
