Students experienced Food Technology, English, Maths and Art, and a 'getting to know each other' activity.



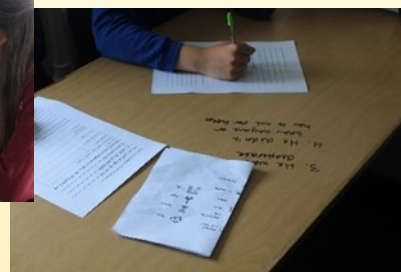

Dear Parents

Welcome to our last newsletter of the 2022/23 academic year! I am sure everyone is looking forward to a well-deserved break and a chance to relax. It certainly has been a packed year and, as always, students and staff of The Cowplain School have engaged with a diverse and varied set of activities, as well as their 5 lessons a day!

I want to mention one of the things we implemented this year and report on its success. Firstly, you know, from September last year, we increased our school day to 32.5 hours, with another two hours for Year 11. I am sure many students, staff and parents have forgotten we did this as it has just seamlessly become the new routine! We made this change, not because the government told us to, but because we wanted to invest in Reading. We know that being literate, and able to read, write and talk effectively, is arguably one of the most important skills that we can give young people – it really is the route to success in so many areas. I am pleased to say that the programme we implemented has been extremely successful and is proving to be a good use of the extra time. Every tutor group reads daily and many of our students do more, as Reading Ambassadors or working with those older children to develop their own reading skills, whilst we have seen some remarkable improvement in the reading ages of a number of children. Next year, we will continue to develop and refine the scheme, as well as looking to further test and measure its success.

I should also mention some of the Summer events in which our students have participated; for example, we have run two very successful camps for Years 8 and 9, with great feedback from students, staff, volunteers and parents. I would like to commend the work of our volunteers; every year they come back, volunteering to give up one or two weeks of their time to live under canvas and support our staff and young people. It really is something special about The Cowplain School and we are very lucky to have such a dedicated number of those people.

Year 11 also finished their exams and we said goodbye to them at our Leavers' Assembly and Prom. The event, at Southdowns Manor, really was a great evening and it was fantastic to see so many confident young people complete their time at The Cowplain School before they move on to other things. I know you will wish them well and we look forward to seeing them again in late August to collect their results.

Next year promises to be another busy one as we are likely to receive our OFSTED inspection, I suspect early in the year. I would like to flag that up to you as your support is vital in completing the parental questionnaire that we will send when OFSTED call, hopefully relaying to the inspection team the success that your child is achieving at the school. I receive so many great emails and phone calls from parents throughout the year and I really hope you can pass this on to the inspectors when they call!
