Dear Parents

Welcome to the first newsletter of the 2023/24 academic year.

It seems like yesterday when our then Year 6 students joined us for their taster day in the warm weather of July; now, with the weather reminding us we are in Autumn, they are firmly established in the school. They have certainly packed a lot in during their first half-term and I am pleased that they have made an excellent start to the year.

As we welcome a new Year 7, we are also mindful that our Year 11 students are already a half-term into their last year at The Cowplain School. Most are working hard and we expect great things from them. We are mindful though of rebuilding 'belonging and buy-in' to the school, things that have perhaps taken a bit of a knock because of the pandemic. We know this is an issue with society generally; people are not so invested in jobs or institutions that they see as perhaps less important than before.

Therefore, Mrs Clemas and myself have held meetings with a group of Year 11s to look at how we can foster this sense of belonging. So, this week has been 'Milestones' week for Year 11 in which each of their subject teachers has paused for a part of a lesson to remind students of what they have already achieved so far this half-term. It really is important that, not only do they of course look to improve, but also that they reflect on what they have already achieved to give themselves a metaphorical 'pat on the back' and instil self-confidence for the year ahead. We will continue to meet with our Year 11 students and work with them to plan further 'milestone' events over the year.

Writing above about 'buy-in,' I want to mention attendance. Firstly, I have received lots of requests to authorise holidays in term time and I need to tell you that most requests will not be authorised. We welcome the government's drive on improving attendance and thus it is very difficult for me to support holiday requests. Remember, if you submit a request and are disappointed that I have not authorised it, it is not us telling you that you *cannot* go on holiday, that is your decision, but a note to say that we cannot support you if you go and that you may be fined. It is part of a wider need for us to raise attendance levels to those that we saw before the pandemic and I would urge you to support us in ensuring your child attends school at all times that they are fit to do so.

As usual, this newsletter is packed with interesting activities that our students have enjoyed over the last seven weeks, which I know you will enjoy reading about.

As always, thank you for your support and I look forward to welcoming your child back after the half-term break
