WW1 Battlefields







Four Year 9 students participated in a national WW1 Battlefields tour scheme with a selection of other schools from across the south of England. They visited a number of memorials and battlefields across France and Belgium, learning about the war and how

it evolved over four years of conflict. The students visited the graves and memorials of soldiers who had given their lives protecting Britain and were able to develop their understanding of the roles played by soldiers from Australia, New Zealand, Canada, India and China who all fought and died protecting Britain. The students were privileged to witness the last post ceremony at the Menin Gate in Belgium where they honour the memory of the 54,000 soldiers who died in Belgium and have no known grave. The students personal highlight of the trip was being able to explore a recreation of the trenches that the British and German troops would have lived and fought in and empathise with how difficult their lives must have been.

Holocaust Memorial Day Service

Holocaust Memorial Day was created on 27 January 2000, when representatives from 46 governments around the world met in Stockholm to discuss Holocaust education, remembrance and research. At the end of their meeting, all attendees signed a declaration committing to preserving the memory of those who were murdered in the Holocaust.






